

## **Workshop: EMI for CLIL at the Multilingual University**

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In the past the role of language centres in higher education was to prepare students to study their subjects in the foreign language abroad. Increasingly higher education in Germany is being offered through the medium of English and, to a lesser extent, in other languages. This has provided new challenges for language centres – preparing both students and teachers to teach and learn their subject through the medium of a foreign/second language. Language centres throughout Europe are meeting this challenge in a variety of ways.

In this workshop we will share examples of best practice and the different models that have been developed with the aim of setting up an informal German (or even European) network to continue the discussion after the AKS conference. In the spirit of multilingualism participants may use their mother tongue or another language they are comfortable/ familiar with and examples of CLIL provision from other languages than English will be most welcome.
